

IF you would like help creating a Profile (see below) please send the requested info. and photo (s) to Nancy W. at dnpk@shaw.ca for formatting. The final Profile will be sent to you for proofing before being printed in color for inclusion in the binder.

Please provide the following information, as it pertains to you:

Your name, and studio name (if you have one);

Born where (when, if you wish);

- How you 'came to clay' (sentence or 2).
- What sort of work you do (i.e. predominantly wheel thrown, or otherwise)
- What clay you use (stoneware, porcelain?); How you fire & what temp (i.e. Cone ____ in gas, electric, wood kiln, other?).
- Background (educational or other). Include defining clay classes, important teachers, workshops, etc. (a few sentences).
- Do you work alone (where), or as part of a group studio (how that works);
- Influences (Westcoast, particular style, etc.) a sentence or two.
- Various work you make (i.e. raku, porcelain, pit-fired ware, etc).
- Location(s) where your work can be seen/purchased. Regular shows you participate in?
- Do you teach; provide workshops? (what are they); Is your work published (book/ magazine title, publisher)



Dear Nancy, At this point, there are 4 openings still in the workshop. As regards accommodations, there a couple of motels at the freeway offramp about a mile from here. Participants are permitted to car camp or pitch tents on the property here, though there is no provision for bathroom facilities, only a porta-potty. It's about a mile to the local YW/YMCA where there are showers available for a small fee. There is also the possibility of a room in the house of a local participant, but that is her decision, not mine.

Total cost is \$300 plus a materials fee of \$80. This is of course US dollars. There is also an extensive list of tools and supplies that the participants are expected to bring with them. That would entail additional expense depending on how much of the list is already in possession.


