January's Meeting - Meira Matheson - Influences

We know Meira as one of our members and perhaps recognize that she must have something to do with the Metchosin Summer School of the Arts (MISSA). Ms. Mathison is actually an experienced arts administrator (the long time Director of MISSA and current Head of the MISSA Clay Department) and a teacher as well as a renown and well-connected potter.

January's presentation went beyond the usual 'how to' talk. Meira spoke about how one develops an identifiable, personal style – addressing a question we all encounter at some time in our clay journeys –

"How can you make a pot that is your own?"

She sees influences affecting how one works as being beyond the technique used; and a very important thing for guild members to consider as they progress. She focused on the challenge of not just copying a form or technique but taking a design and making a personal expressive statement. Meira considers influences to be subtle, often un-noticed. The smallest, most common things (such as one's pet) can influence how a potter works and become integrated into the personal statement they make.

Meira traced the influences of her clay history for us.

From earliest times she found gardening, flowers and the colours of that environment affected what she made. Randy Brodnax brought to her attention the importance of glaze and decoration as it is integrated with the form of pots. Tom Coleman further focused her on glazes – particularly shinos and copper reds. The colours of desert rocks near the Valley of Fire and desert lichens added to her pallet.

A visit to David Leach and his pottery in southern England affected the forms Meira made.

The shape of ferns as they developed influenced the shape of nobs on the lids of her pots. Oilcans became teapots. Over time, Meira's pieces became increasingly 'altered'. Her attendance of Kathryn Finnerty's workshop in Red Deer (Alberta) encouraged this. Further texture was supplied by the addition of slips.

Meira's perspective changed as her life changed. The birth of a grandson and the increased importance of family in her life lead Meira to make pots that started to 'cuddle'. Her trip to China provided an abundance of influences – many not yet processed.

Most recently, Meira has been making large, beauty, double.





Most recently, Meira has been making large, heavy, double-walled vessels. She likes the increased volume that these allow, but is not happy with the concomitant increase in loss, i.e. breakage. Crows and bunnies continue to be ongoing themes in her work; balancing the fact that raku is no longer part of her regular repertoire.

Looking back, Meira credits many people with influencing how her work developed. Randy, Tom and the Banff Centre's Les Manning encouraged her to follow her own path. Teaching – strangers or her grandson – provided further clues as to where she might go.
